Hosting of the Osaka-Kansai Expo Event: "Rare and Intractable Diseases — Step Forward Together (RDD x NANBYO Day Collaboration)"

Let's Think Together, Joyfully and Inclusively – RDD x NANBYO Day

- ·A collaborative event between RDD (Rare Disease Day) and NANBYO Day will be held at the Osaka-Kansai EXPO venue.
- ·The only public event focused specifically on "NANBYO (rare and intractable diseases)" in the EXPO.
- ·Scheduled on Friday, May 23, commemorating the enactment of Japan's NANBYO Law

We are pleased to announce the upcoming Osaka-Kansai Expo event: "Rare and Intractable Diseases – Step Forward Together (RDD x NANBYO Day Collaboration): Let's Think Together, Joyfully and Inclusively."

The field of rare diseases encompasses diverse communities formed by patients, families, and stakeholders. In 2016, an NGO Committee for Rare Diseases was established within the United Nations, followed by the adoption of a rare disease resolution at the UN General Assembly in December 2021. Additionally, Rare Disease International (RDI), a global patient organization, was officially recognized as a WHO collaborating organization in May 2024.

Rare Disease Day (RDD), the world's largest awareness campaign aiming to improve the quality of life (QOL) for people with rare and intractable diseases through better diagnosis and treatment, is supported by these international organizations. In Japan, the RDD secretariat is hosted by NPO ASrid, with 2025 marking the 16th anniversary of RDD Japan.

The World EXPO is highly significant for the rare disease community. At Expo 2020 Dubai (2021–2022), EURORDIS, which hosts the global RDD secretariat, organized the "Global Rare Disease Day Event" on RDD's designated date, February 28, 2022.

However, the Osaka-Kansai EXPO 2025 does not fall in February. Therefore, Japan will mark its international contribution by hosting this event on May 23, recognized domestically as NANBYO Day, commemorating the enactment of the Act on Medical Care for Patients with Intractable/Rare Diseases on May 23, 2014. Since 2015, national patient councils have hosted events annually to raise awareness around this day.

This event will be Japan's first rare disease-themed EXPO event organized by patients, families, and supporters. Collaborating partners include the RDD community, officially registered organizers and companies in the Kansai region, the Japan Patients Association (JPA), and junior and senior high schools that host RDD events.

We aim to present and reflect on the present and future of rare and intractable diseases — both in the context of Japan's national NANBYO policies and global initiatives — and to inspire action. The event

will also feature a range of entertainment, jointly delivered with patients, families, and supporters.

We are honored to announce that Her Imperial Highness Crown Princess Akishino is scheduled to attend the event.

We warmly welcome participation from all.

Rare diseases are defined by their low prevalence and complex pathophysiology, often resulting in delayed treatment or drug development. Rare Disease Day (RDD) began in Europe in 2008 and has since expanded to over 100 countries. Japan joined in 2010 with the first event held in Tokyo and has grown steadily.

Participants include patients, families, healthcare providers, drug developers, researchers, and the general public. RDD is gaining recognition as a key initiative that bridges rare disease communities with society.
